I. Course Description:

In Exploration Class, you will experience many levels of <u>personal musical growth</u>. Musical learning will involve the use of music technology, playing percussion, composing music tracks, etc. No formal music training or special technical skills are required. At the end of the semester, you will make an audio CD of the music that you created and performed in class!

There will be lots of music sharing in class, including playing music tracks that you create! You also get to play on a variety of percussion instruments. Playing on these instruments will reinforce what you learn about rhythm. Students will play alone and with others! There might even be opportunities for you to be involved in some of our Chorus performances here at Peasley!

II. Essential Understandings:

<u>Elements of Music</u>: Students will participate in a variety of experiences as a means of studying melody, rhythm and harmony.

<u>Creativity</u>: The students will employ creativity in a variety of music experiences. Students will work alone or with a partner to complete lesson modules on composing music using traditional music notation. Students will also explore the practice of using pre-recorded loops to compose music.

<u>Investigate</u>: Students will describe performances; live or recorded, using appropriate music terminology. The music selected for these listening sessions will include a wide variety of music from different styles and time periods.

<u>Connect</u>: Students will demonstrate appropriate performance behavior as a participant and/or listener.

III. Required Materials and Supplies:

Pencil. Optionally you may wish to have a flash drive if would like to keep a copy of your projects.

IV. Classroom Expectations: (beyond the Student Code of Conduct)

- 1. Follow Directions
- 2. Be on time for each rehearsal/lesson
- 3. Be respectful (friendly) to each person in the room
- 4. Keep hand and feet to yourself
- 5. No hats, food or drinks (except water)
- 6. No personal electronic devices during class

V. Grading and Student Evaluation:

A. Assignments and Projects

- <u>Participation</u>: Students will participate in daily activities that will include rhythm and counting exercises. These activities will promote music reading and help develop musical listening skills.
- <u>Music Composition Lessons</u>: Students will work alone or with a partner to complete lesson modules on composing music. Short melodic and rhythmic compositions will be created using traditional music notation software. Other music compositions will be created using loop-based software.
- <u>Skill Checks</u>: Each student will play alone, or with others to demonstrate understanding of counting in music and rhythm playing.
- <u>Music Ace Lessons</u>: Students are expected to complete **ten** computer sessions (Music Ace). Each session involves completing a lesson followed by a fun game.
- <u>Music Class Work</u>: Students will learn basic concepts about music. This seatwork will sometimes involve completing worksheets or other assignments.
- <u>Student Reflection</u>: Each student will be required to write and record a final reflection highlighting his or her best work.
